President's POINT OF VIEW

To Be Thankful...

As this newsletter reaches your mailbox, the election will have been completed and Thanksgiving Day is around the corner. Hopefully you exercised your right to cast your ballot and, if you are like me, you are thankful for not only the opportunity to do so but find peace with the exit of polarizing advertisements.

As I reflect on those things that we should be thankful for, many things come to mind. Thanks to the village staff for their work each day keeping the community safe and clean. Thanks to Community Enrichment Director Holly and her team for community minded activities like the Pumpkin Walk, the renovation of Verhagen Park, the opening of the Splash Pad, and supporting the Kimberly Recreation Association in their fall festival which had Treaty Park thriving. Thanks to the Fire Department for another terrific open house. Thanks, in particular to Chief Hietpas for his many years of service. We wish him well in retirement and give all support to newly appointed Chief Chad Smith as he continues the great volunteer work of this amazing group.

We are thankful to our two newest team members as Anna Huber joins the team as the Deputy Director of Public Works and Sam Schroeder as our Community Development Director. These two individuals join the village team with unique skill sets and experience that will benefit us greatly, welcome aboard!

We are thankful for progress being made as we rebuild the street and parks facility. This project replaces a cobbled together building which has served the community for more than sixty years. When completed next year, the staff will have a safer and more secure facility to carry out their work. As I have shared in the past, this project does come at a cost to all of us. After years of responsible budget management and making do with the facility, the need could not be "put off" any longer. To fulfill the need, we have secured funding via bonding. The village's long history of responsible fiscal management yielded excellent rates for the borrowing, but we have debt service needs that we will all see when tax bills arrive. The cost initially will be in the neighborhood of a \$1.18 increase to the mill rate. This will bring our tax rate to nearly \$8.25 for this year; we anticipate it decreasing next year as valuations rise throughout the village. These numbers are pretty solid estimates as I write this ahead of our final review and consideration of the budget for 2025. I think it is important to note that the village tax rate was \$9.85 in the 1990's.

We are thankful for the continuing development along the Fox River. New and attractive housing opportunities rising up along North Wilson Street and within the Blue at the Trail development are another added piece of the redevelopment puzzle. It was with great anticipation that we welcomed Festival Foods to the community in late September. The rebirth of this property is a most welcome addition to the village and boy, did the Festival team do it right!

We are thankful and grateful for the continued civility that is truly the fabric of the village. People supporting one another, neighbors be neighborly, a school system that thrives with engaged teachers and staff, students and parents. We are continually blessed with volunteer work throughout the community. Whether it be serving on a committee, a board or commission, adopting a flower bed, serving your place of worship or just taking part of the many opportunities to engage in community activities, we are grateful.

Yes, so much to be thankful for and yet, so much more to be done as we collectively work to keep Kimberly a great place to live, learn, work and play.

Holiday Schedule & Garbage Route Changes

Thanksgiving Holiday

All Village offices and departments will be **CLOSED** on **Thursday, November 28th** and **Friday, November 29th** in observance of the Thanksgiving Holiday.

Thanksgiving week **EVERYONES** garbage day is **CHANGING** to one day prior to your normal pick-up day.

Christmas Holiday

All Village offices and departments will be **CLOSED** on **Tuesday, December 24th** and **Wednesday, December 25th**.

Garbage: Tuesday Route on Monday, Wednesday Route on Thursday, and Thursdays Route on Friday.

Recycling: Monday and Tuesday remain the same. Wednesday Route on Thursday and Thursday Route on Friday.

New Year's Holiday

All Village offices and departments will be **CLOSED** on **Wednesday, January 1, 2025**.

Garbage: Tuesday remain the same, Wednesday Route on Thursday and Thursday Route on Friday.

STREET DEPARTMENT

Garbage & Recycling Reminders for Winter and the Upcoming Holidays

- The days for **Bulky, Non-Metal Collection** were **changed five years ago to Monday and Wednesday** for the designated week each month. Please reference the 2025 Garbage and Recycling Calendar for the collection dates.
- Polycarts CANNOT be placed in the road or on top of snow piles
- The polycart MUST be placed at ground level either on the terrace or in the driveway. Polycarts which are placed in the road for pick up, during winter months, are subject to be plowed over and damaged. Replacement of damaged carts are the responsibility of the property owner at the cost of \$73.50.
- The Village DOES NOT pick up overflow garbage. Excess garbage generated due to the holidays must be disposed of by the renter or property owner. This can be done by spreading your overflow garbage over a couple of weeks' collection, asking a neighbor if they have room in their polycart, or by hauling the overflow garbage to the landfill.

Weekly Brush Pickup

Brush which is longer than 18" and not more than 4" in diameter MUST be called in by 2:00 p.m. on WEDNESDAY for a Thursday pickup.

Winter Driving

- Remember to slow down and drive with extra caution during the winter season. Allow more time for your trips to school, work, and shopping.
- The Village will maintain the street pavement as best they can. This does not mean the pavement will be completely free of snow and ice.
- There will always be situations where snow and/or ice build-up will occur on our streets and intersections especially early in the morning or later in the evening.
- Allow extra room when following other vehicles, approach intersections with extra caution, and assume your vehicle will not stop as fast as it does on dry pavement.
- Remain at least 200ft. behind snow plows and spreaders.

Snow Removal

- Village ordinance 430-10 states that it is unlawful to shovel, blow, or plow snow onto or across Village streets or alleys. Citations will be issued to habitual offenders.
- Salt barrels placed at specific intersections are to be used for emergency use only. These salt barrels are not provided for residents for their own application. Salt for sidewalks and driveways should be purchased at local retail outlets.
- Corner lot owners are asked to keep a path open through the crosswalks, the Village crew will clear the remainder of snow as time permits.
- Anyone with a fire hydrant near his or her property is asked to help keep the snow cleared from around it. This will allow for quick response time if ever the fire department needs to access the hydrant.
- Snow must be cleared from the sidewalks within 24 hours after each snowfall. If ice builds up, it must be removed or treated with a melting agent. It is Village policy to address unshoveled sidewalks only when a complaint has been filed, village officials do not go out looking for sidewalks that need shoveling.

Snow Removal Notice

To Property Owners In The Village Of Kimberly

Notice is hereby given to each person who owns, occupies, or controls land that fronts upon or abuts any sidewalk in the Village of Kimberly, Outagamie County, State of Wisconsin. The Village of Kimberly Code of Ordinances Ch. 430 -10, states that sidewalks are to be kept clear of all snow and ice, to a minimum of five (5) feet in width, within twenty-four (24) hours from the time the snow ceases to accumulate on said sidewalk. In the event that ice has formed on any sidewalk in such a manner that it cannot be removed, the sidewalk shall be sprinkled with material to accelerate melting or prevent slipping. Furthermore, no person shall in any way deposit any snow or ice onto any public street, alley, sidewalk, or public land dedicated to public use. No further written or verbal notice will be given to violators. Failure to comply will result in sidewalks being cleared by the Village and billed at a rate of \$75.00 per hour, plus equipment usage and an Administrative Fee of \$25.00. A minimum of one hour will be charged to clear sidewalks.

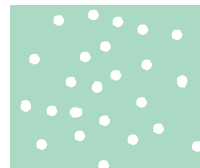

Pet (Dog/Cat) CPR & First Aid

Dogs and cats are part of the family and being equipped to deliver first aid to them in an emergency situation is vital. This course will provide you with the basics in CPR and first aid care to help your furry family member in their time of need. Topics include putting together a pet first aid kit or disaster kit, taking your pets vital signs, choking, performing CPR and rescue breathing, head to tail weekly health inspections, and medical response to seizures, hypothermia, heat stroke, shock, bleeding, poisoning, etc. Upon successful completion of the course students will receive a Pro Pet Hero completion card digitally sent directly to your e-mail address, this card will be valid for two years. This is a great class for all pet owners, pet sitters, and those interested in going into the veterinary field. Please note, no live pets will be present in class. All skills will be performed on pet mannequins. Classes open to students 16 years of age and older. Upcoming classes offered February 26th or May 11th from 5PM – 9PM Course fee is \$65, pre-registration is required.

Dog Licenses

2025 dog licenses will be available at Village Clerk's Office by December 15th, 2024. Neutered and Spayed Licenses are \$7.00. Intact Male & Female Licenses are \$12.00. When applying for a dog license, owners must present the current rabies vaccination certificate. Failure to license your dog may result in a \$124.00 citation per dog, issued by FVMPD.

REMINDER keep your pets leashed, Ordinance 180 states it shall be unlawful for any person within the Village of Kimberly to own, harbor or keep any animal which has been determined to be a public nuisance or allow the animal to run at large in the Village.

180-6C All dogs, cats or other domestic animals shall be kept on a leash no longer than eight feet at all times when off the premises of its owner.

Smoke & CO Detector Maintenance

Please remember to change the batteries in your smoke and CO detectors. While checking the batteries, please inspect the manufacture date – if it is 5-7 years old, you should consider replacing it soon. Many people estimate their detectors are “a couple years old” and we find them to be over 8 years old in many cases. If your detector starts to chirp, it is a sign that something is wrong with it. Usually, the batteries need to be replaced or the detector has reached its service life. Remember, smoke detectors save lives! Civilian fire casualties are anywhere from 35%-69% lower when battery-powered or hard-wired smoke detectors are in good working order.

Do you work shiftwork or have daytime availability?

We are hiring firefighters and EMS members. Members of KF/R can specialize in fire, EMS, or both. No prior training necessary – training provided at no cost to the member.

Do you have a wood burning fireplace?

As the weather shifts, please take the time to have your chimney cleaned and inspected by a professional. Chimneys are the number one cause of fires involving wood-burning appliances. It is a simple item to maintain, and the consequences of not doing so can be catastrophic. Also remember to never burn scrap wood or softwood in your fireplace or wood stoves.

Winter Fire Hydrant Maintenance

A clearly visible fire hydrant could save your home, or even your life. If a hydrant is buried in snow, firefighters could lose valuable time locating it. You can preform a valuable public service by taking responsibility for maintaining “your” hydrant during the Winter. We would like to offer the following suggestions:

- Know the location of your hydrant.
- Make sure it is shoveled clear after each snowfall (at least 3 feet all around).
- Adapt a hydrant and be proud to make it the best-looking hydrant in your area.

§ 463-20 Parking prohibited during certain hours.

B. All-night parking regulated.

(1) When signs have been erected at or reasonably near the corporate limits of the Village of Kimberly, as provided in § 349.13, Wis. Stats., **no person shall park any motor vehicle on any street in the Village of Kimberly between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. between the dates of December 1 and April 1.**

Recycle Properly

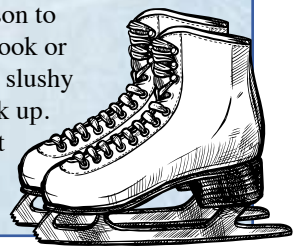
Is Santa bringing new electronics to your house this holiday season? When upgrading to the latest gadget—whether it’s a smartwatch, cellphone, E-bike, or even the robot vacuum cleaner in your closet—it’s easy to overlook what happens when the device reaches the end of its life. But these battery-containing devices can be hazardous if not disposed of properly.

Batteries, especially lithium-ion, pose serious risks. If punctured or improperly disposed of they can cause fires, leak dangerous chemicals, and even explode. So even if your device has served you safely, it will eventually need careful handling.

Ensure your old devices are safely recycled by bringing them to a certified drop-off location, like our Outagamie County Resource Recovery Park located at 1919 Holland Road Appleton, WI 54911.

TREATY PARK ICE RINK
