Leads to Policing Changes

Streets, Sewers, and Safety have been the three leading priorities in governance within the Village of Kimberly for decades and remains such today and in the years ahead. Funding each is a priority and a challenge that calls for constant review of processes and costs. This focus led to the forming of a partnership with our neighbors to the north for policing some thirty years ago. The formation of the Fox Valley Metro Police Department (FVMPD) served both communities well in professional policing and fiscal management for more than three decades. We have always been pleased with the professionalism of the policing team.

Being true champions of the team and the work done by the FVMPD does not, in itself negate the need to explore the costs and processes of this department, like all other departments. The Village Board and Administration have done just that. However, the FVMPD is a unique Department, a joint partnership with the Village of Little Chute. Any major modification, capital investment or operational change requires agreement by both Villages. Several factors of the joint partnership discussion were cause for concern: variations in municipal growth boundaries, incompatible visions related to cost share policies, potential inconsistencies in service agreements, and irreconcilable differences related to ownership of shared assets.

The cost analysis was prompted by several reasons such as the introduction of administrative service costs, upcoming facility needs and renovations that had been long overdue, cost sharing policies, municipal growth boundaries and service agreements. The most imminent being evidence storage. Faced with the need to find suitable housing for storage of evidence for several years, the Village Boards have discussed several options in concept: rental space, purchasing storage, and the construction of a new storage facility. The ideal concept building layout for a new 4,800 square foot addition to the Safety Center, offering 1,500 square feet of required storage space to be located in Little Chute came in at an estimate cost in excess of \$1 million. Several cost sharing and ownership factors were yet to be decided; however, it was apparent that the joint partnership agreement drafted thirty years ago likely needed to be revisited and alternatives explored.

While the Village Board has always worked to provide the tools necessary to do the job for all departments, the evidence storage facility cost, and ownership discussion was certainly one worthy of deeper exploration. As part of the Village Board's analysis to find solutions and alternatives, we approached the Outagamie County Sheriff's Department to ask if they might entertain leasing space in their facility to accommodate the need for evidence storage. Most readers would be surprised at the amount of evidence that is required to be cataloged, climate controlled and held for years and years. Outagamie County does not allow other departments to store evidence at their facility. However, one question did remain – would the County be available and open to providing police services to the Village of Kimberly in order to solve many problems related to evidence storage and growing concerns related to the joint partnership.

At the request of the Village Board, Outagamie County Sheriff's Department generated a proposal for police coverage 24 hours per day, 7 days per week, patrolling the Village of Kimberly exclusively. The estimated cost for service was a significant reduction, in excess of \$250,000, compared to the 2025 budget for police service.

The Board then met with the Sheriff's Department to learn specifics regarding processes, coverage and availability of other county services beyond patrol such as K-9 unit, school resource officers, emergency response team, investigation, crime scene analysis, Metropolitan Drug Enforcement Group, drone team, bomb squad, internet crimes against children task force, administrative, human resources and finance services. It is important to clarify that with the County proposal the deputies assigned to the Village of Kimberly work ONLY and SPECIFICALLY within the Village boundary. In the listening sessions there seemed to be a misconception that patrol was from other points of the County, this is not accurate.

Further, under the County proposal there will be a Sargent available at the Municipal Complex to serve as a resource for residents and staff. The Village will still fulfill our partnership with the Kimberly Area School District to staff school resource officers for the schools within our municipal boundary. The Outagamie County Sherriff's Department has had many successes serving in this capacity. The Village Board also requested that immediate consideration be given to any FVMPD team member who may want to change organizations to which the County agreed.

Following the Board's initial analysis, Community Listening Sessions were held to help interested parties to understand the proposal from the County and current services provided by FVMPD. Questions were posed and opinions shared. Again, it is important to clarify that with the County proposal the deputies assigned to the Village of Kimberly work ONLY and SPECIFICALLY within the Village boundary. Patrol coverage will increase in the Village. Officers per square mile will increase to 0.87-1.3 officers per square mile, versus the current coverage of 0.46 officers per square mile.

A Village survey was available for the public; of which only 4% of the population of Kimberly completed, or 322 out of 7,656 residents. Of those that responded, most were largely in favor of keeping the partnership. Comments were shared expressing a desire to continue efforts to find a way forward together with our Little Chute partners. We did just that. We explored ways to find cost savings, to address future growth, analyze future capital improvements, modify the cost sharing framework, and establish more oversight of facility planning, operations and budgets.

Over the summer, conversations with our partners in Little Chute centered on the evidence storage needs, updating the current Safety Center located in Little Chute, the potential to revisit the cost share formula to more accurately align miles patrolled as Little Chute grows north and finally an earnest discussion about a recently imposed administrative fee of \$47,000 annually submitted to the Village of Kimberly by Little Chute during a Joint Meeting of the Village Boards in March of 2025. This administrative fee was delivered to the Village Board with no prior discussion and a first in the 30-year partnership. Discussions on these topics unfortunately did not yield compromise nor answers as to what true costs would face the Village of Kimberly over the next 10-20 years.

After weighing the cost, coverage, impacts on employees, and long-term sustainability of the partnership, the Village Board unanimously has given notice to our long-time partners in Little Chute that we will dissolve our joint agreement. The agreement calls for a three-year separation period should either community choose to dissolve and, of course we will honor that. However, we are open to adjusting the termination date in accordance with the needs of our valued neighbors, just as we did when Little Chute chose to dissolve our partnerships for shared custodial work and again with the joint library agreement.

As we solidify the transition timeline and plan, we will communicate it via our website and social media pages. Until such time it will be business as usual with FVMPD.

When the transition takes place there should be no need for anxiety or concern as the plan calls for dedicated officers serving Kimberly and a plethora of nearby support from Sheriff's deputies. It is expected that we will see more patrol due to the smaller footprint to navigate within the Village limits, as well as support staff completing paperwork associated with policing allowing for more uninterrupted patrol time. Residents will be seeing silver patrol vehicles, versus blue patrol vehicles, which will proudly carry the Village of Kimberly designation emblazoned on their side panels. In the proposed County agreement, the Village has access to all of the specialty policing that the County has, from investigators to drone operators to a robust SWAT team. All of these services are included in our agreed upon cost and is nearly \$250,000 below the current cost of police service.

As the Village realizes savings, it is our intention to utilize these funds for priorities that will serve the taxpayers. Two specific needs come to mind: first, earmark funds to "buy down" debt for the new Municipal Services Center building and second, fund a revolving account to assist residents in replacing lead water services (this great idea was one generated from comments from our listening sessions). Discussions will be held regarding the use of available funds with each budget cycle, which the community is always welcome to be a part of during our Open Meetings.

This has been a difficult decision for several reasons. Foremost is the well-being of the current FVMPD team followed closely with concerns for "losing our identity." We believe that in our planning we have considered both and can assure you, this Village Board would NEVER COMPROMISE SAFETY. The Village Board believes we lose nothing in the safety arena and, likely, will gain patrol presence and with it, criminal deterrence. Change for many is never easy and our ears are open to addressing any concerns or questions in order to ease any anxiety amid this pending change.

As we assemble the staff specifically assigned to the Village of Kimberly we will feature them in KimTalk so you can place a name with a face as we welcome these law enforcement professionals into the community as they work to keep Kimberly a great place to live, learn work and play.....SAFELY!

A Fresh Look, Familiar Welcome: Big Changes at Kimberly Public Library

The Kimberly Public Library is getting a fresh new look! While we undergo a short construction project in August to install new carpet, paint, and a hearing loop system for improved accessibility, we're also embracing the opportunity to deepen the community's understanding of Kimberly Library's brand—a collection of imagery, relationships, and experiences that reflect who we are and what we stand for.

Our brand is more than a logo or color scheme, and our identity is about more than fresh paint or new carpet. Kimberly Library is a **pillar of the Kimberly area**, rooted in the values Village residents hold dear. Whether you're looking to learn something new, meet a neighbor, gain worldly perspectives, or simply enjoy time in a safe, welcoming space, we invite you to make the Kimberly Public Library your third home.

STREET DEPARTMENT

Fall Leaf Collection

Leaves will be picked up on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays

The Street Department will start Leaf Pick Up services when there are enough leaves raked to the street terraces through the Village to keep assigned crews and equipment busy for at least a full day. The starting date will vary from year to year. Leaf collection activities will continue in the Fall as long as weather permits.

Rake leaves to the terrace, not into the street, DO NOT put leaves in bags. Leaves, that are placed in bags or any container – WILL NOT BE PICKED UP.

Do not rake twigs or branches with the leaves, they will clog and damage the vacuum. Please keep plastic and paper out of the piles. Rake leaves into low piles so children are not hidden from motorist's view.

Pick up will start at the west-end of the Village and move east, completing as soon as possible. It takes about one week to make one round of the entire Village, so please be patient and rake accordingly.

Please be aware that the street sweeper is different from the leaf vacuum. The sweeper only sweeps streets, not piles of leaves.

To keep residents informed of our progress and anticipated route for collection, the Village of Kimberly has created "Leaf Man" which you can follow on Facebook @villageofkimberlywi. Kimberly Water Department Customers 2025 Semi Annual Hydrant Flushing

The Kimberly Water Department will be cleaning and flushing water mains from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. **beginning September 15th – 18th and September 22nd – 25th.** The flushing will remove most of the natural minerals that have settled in the mains such as iron, a harmless-reddish brown mineral that does discolor the water.

If you observe Water Utility Personnel working in your area, refrain from using water or use as little as possible for 45 minutes to ensure that the water has settled in the mains. This will also help prevent any iron from being drawn into your water piping system.

If you do find that your water has become discolored, refrain from using it for an additional 30 minutes. Then draw off the remaining discolored water through the **COLD WATER FAUCET ONLY.**

Your cooperation during this flushing procedure will benefit all water customers.

Yard Waste Site Temporary Relocation

The Kimberly yard waste site and metal dumpster have been temporarily relocated to the Sunset Beach Parking Lot at 1010 Fulcer Avenue. The waste oil drop off site is temporarily unavailable, residents interested in disposing of waste oil are encouraged to utilize the free drop off service with the Outagamie County Landfill. The village will post updated signage at the yard waste sites and information to our social media pages informing residents when the site reopens at the original location.

Free Fall Yard Waste

The Village of Kimberly will provide a free fall yard waste pick up ONLY on the following day: MONDAY, OCTOBER 6th for residents NORTH of the tracks or MONDAY, OCTOBER 13th for residents SOUTH of the tracks. Yard waste consisting of garden debris, flowers, lawn edgings, and shrub trimmings (not to exceed 18" in length) will be picked up. Yard Waste must be put in lawn and yard waste bags and not exceed 50lbs. Yard waste stickers are not required during the FREE fall yard waste pick up. Once a street has been picked up, they WILL NOT return! NO GRASS CLIPPINGS, LEAVES OR PLASTIC BAGS!

Brush Collection

The village offers a weekly curbside brush collection service on Thursdays. Simply add your address by using this form https:// forms.gle/S7AY932PAZa3hp7w5, scanning the QR Code, locating the link on our website homepage, or by calling 920-788-7507. All requests must be submitted before 3:30 p.m. on Wednesdays to be scheduled for a Thursday collection the same week. All brush must be 18" or longer, less than 4" in diameter, piled neatly on the terrace with all cut ends facing the same direction, with no root balls.

Scammers are very sophisticated these days. Stay one step ahead of them and don't let them fool you into thinking you owe the village money for permits, fines, taxes, etc.


Be suspicious of unusual payment methods and remember that the village would not ask you for a wire transfer or solicit a payment from you over the phone.
