President's POINT OF VIEW

New Municipal Services Facility Ready to Serve the Community

We're excited to announce the opening of the new Municipal Services Center located at 426 W. Kimberly Avenue—designed to meet the needs of our community for the next 50 years. After nearly two years of planning and construction, this facility replaces the more than 60-year-old “street department,” which had long outlived its usefulness after multiple conversions and renovations. This new center will serve as your hub for park and recreation services, permitting, street services, development and more.

As staff settle into the new space, we'll share details about the services offered here and those still available at the existing Municipal Complex. We also plan to host an open house so you can see firsthand the significant improvements made in vehicle storage, maintenance, and workspace for our dedicated team.

As mentioned in the last edition of KimTalk, we're working closely with our partners in Little Chute to transition to Kimberly Community Policing in collaboration with Outagamie County. Starting in January, two dedicated officers will begin patrolling Kimberly, with more joining throughout the year. While a full separation date from Little Chute hasn't been finalized, they've agreed to the transition plan and cost-sharing arrangements as they develop their long-term strategy. We look forward to welcoming our new “Kimberly” officers as they begin their mission to protect and serve.

In 2026, village residents will have access to affordable rental space at the Scenic Overlook building—perfect for hosting showers, small weddings, family gatherings, and more. This unique venue is a restored piece of our history, once part of the former paper mill, and brought back to life with support from Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation (WEDC) funding. Located along Papermill Run, it offers indoor and outdoor seating, restrooms, and a small kitchen. Trail users will also have access to the restrooms.

As tax bills arrive, we want to acknowledge the careful budgeting efforts made by staff. The average homeowner will see a modest increase of about 2.1% in municipal service costs. These services include snow and ice removal, park programming, safety services, library access, street lighting and cleaning, trash and recycling, general government services for election administration, licensing, municipal court, and debt payments for the new Municipal Services Building. Our budgeting process also accounted for rising tipping fees (landfill charges), insurance costs, and general inflation. We've continued planning for future expenses through our five-year capital plan, which includes street reconstruction, computer maintenance, and equipment replacement. While no one enjoys receiving a tax bill, we hope you recognize the thoughtful and realistic approach taken to prepare a responsible budget.

Looking ahead to 2026, we'll also begin a village-wide property revaluation. The Wisconsin Department of Revenue requires this when home prices significantly outpace current valuations, specifically when the assessed value falls below 70% of the market value. We've reached that threshold and have been budgeting for this process over the past three years. When the revaluation begins, you'll receive a special edition of KimTalk explaining the process in detail. It's important to remember: a revaluation does not automatically mean a tax increase. Taxation is driven by spending, not property values. We'll provide clear examples of that in an upcoming edition.

As 2025 comes to a close, I wish you and your loved ones a joyful, family-centered holiday season. I look forward to all that 2026 will bring to our village—a place known for being a great community to live, learn, work, and play.

STREET DEPARTMENT

Garbage & Recycling Reminders for Winter and the Upcoming Holidays

- **Bulky, Non-Metal Collection** is scheduled once a month. Please reference the 2026 Kimbely Garbage and Recycling Calendar for collection dates.
- Polycarts CANNOT be placed in the road or on top of snow piles
- The polycart MUST be placed at ground level either on the terrace or in the driveway. Polycarts which are placed in the road for pick up, during winter months, are subject to be plowed over and damaged. Replacement of damaged carts are the responsibility of the property owner at the cost of \$73.50.
- The Village DOES NOT pick up overflow garbage. Excess garbage generated due to the holidays must be disposed of by the renter or property owner. This can be done by spreading your overflow garbage over a couple of weeks' collection, asking a neighbor if they have room in their polycart, or by hauling the overflow garbage to the landfill.

Winter Driving

- Remember to slow down and drive with extra caution during the winter season. Allow more time for your trips to school, work, and shopping.
- The Village will maintain the street pavement as best they can. This does not mean the pavement will be completely free of snow and ice.
- There will always be situations where snow and/or ice build-up will occur on our streets and intersections especially early in the morning or later in the evening.
- Allow extra room when following other vehicles, approach intersections with extra caution, and assume your vehicle will not stop as fast as it does on dry pavement.
- Remain at least 200ft. behind snow plows and spreaders.

Snow Removal

- Village ordinance 430-10 states that it is unlawful to shovel, blow, or plow snow onto or across Village streets or alleys. Citations will be issued to habitual offenders.
- Salt barrels placed at specific intersections are to be used for emergency personnel use only. These salt barrels are not provided for residents for their own application. Salt for sidewalks and driveways should be purchased at local retail outlets.
- Corner lot owners are asked to keep a path open through the crosswalks, the Village crew will clear the remainder of snow as time permits.
- Anyone with a fire hydrant near his or her property is asked to help keep the snow cleared from around it. This will allow for quick response time if ever the fire department needs to access the hydrant.
- Snow must be cleared from the sidewalks within 24 hours after each snowfall. If ice builds up, it must be removed or treated with a melting agent. It is Village policy to address unshoveled sidewalks only when a complaint has been filed, village officials do not go out looking for sidewalks that need shoveling.

Snow Removal Notice

To Property Owners In The Village Of Kimberly

Notice is hereby given to each person who owns, occupies, or controls land that fronts upon or abuts any sidewalk in the Village of Kimberly, Outagamie County, State of Wisconsin. The Village of Kimberly Code of Ordinances Ch. 430 -10, states that sidewalks are to be kept clear of all snow and ice, to a minimum of five (5) feet in width, within twenty-four (24) hours from the time the snow ceases to accumulate on said sidewalk. In the event that ice has formed on any sidewalk in such a manner that it cannot be removed, the sidewalk shall be sprinkled with material to accelerate melting or prevent slipping. Furthermore, no person shall in any way deposit any snow or ice onto any public street, alley, sidewalk, or public land dedicated to public use. No further written or verbal notice will be given to violators. Failure to comply will result in sidewalks being cleared by the Village and billed at a rate of \$75.00 per hour, plus equipment usage and an Administrative Fee of \$25.00. A minimum of one hour will be charged to clear sidewalks.

The Street Department will ONLY pick up trees curbside on your garbage day the week of January 13 – 15th. Residents can also drop off at the yard waste site.

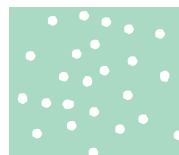

Sunset Park Playground Project

The Village of Kimberly has approved over \$200,000 to purchase new playground equipment in 2026 for Sunset Park. This is in replacement of equipment that has reached well past its lifespan in an area of Sunset Park that is directly adjacent to the Shelter #1 & #2 area and the scenic overlook. The playground equipment is scheduled to be installed in Spring of 2026 with poured in place surfacing making the entire playground accessible to people of all abilities. The new playground includes four different slides, swings for people of all abilities, three spinning elements, and a climbing area.

The Village is soliciting for donations to support site amenities like bike racks, benches, picnic tables, trees, and a drinking fountain. Fall/Winter Yard Waste

As you clean up your yard this Fall and Winter, please remember that burning yard waste is not allowed in the Village of Kimberly. This is a violation of Village Ordinance 270-8 regarding open burning.

Only small, attended recreational fires are permitted, using clean, natural wood in a fire pit no larger than 4 feet in diameter.

Stay Safe: Check Your Carbon Monoxide Alarms

Carbon monoxide (CO) is a colorless, odorless gas that can be deadly. Make sure your home is protected by installing carbon monoxide alarms near sleeping areas and checking them regularly. Test your alarms monthly and replace batteries as needed. If your alarm sounds, leave your home immediately and call emergency services. ***A working CO alarm could save your life—don't wait to check!***

FOX VALLEY METRO

Overnight Winter Parking Restrictions

§ 463-20 Parking prohibited during certain hours. B. All-night parking regulated.

(1) When signs have been erected at or reasonably near the corporate limits of the Village of Kimberly, as provided in § 349.13, Wis. Stats., **no person shall park any motor vehicle on any street in the Village of Kimberly between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. between the dates of December 1 and April 1.**

Consideration can be given on limited and case-by-case basis. Any resident requesting special permission may request consideration via the Fox Valley Metro Police Department's website or by scanning the QR code.



CLERK-TREASURER

Dog Licenses

2026 Dog licenses will be available at Village Clerk's Office by December 15th, 2025. Neutered and Spayed Licenses are \$7.00. Intact Male & Female Licenses are \$12.00. When applying for a dog license, owners must present the current rabies vaccination certificate. Failure to license your dog may result in a \$124.00 citation per dog, issued by FVMPD.

REMINDER keep your pets leashed, Ordinance 180 states it shall be unlawful for any person within the Village of Kimberly to own, harbor or keep any animal which has been determined to be a public nuisance or allow the animal to run at large in the Village.

180-6C All dogs, cats or other domestic animals shall be kept on a leash no longer than eight feet at all times when off the premises of its owner.

An election will be held in the Village of Kimberly on Tuesday, April 7, 2026 to elect three (3) Trustee positions and Village President. Candidate paperwork can be picked up in the Clerk's Office or downloaded from elections.wi.gov. Simply select the Candidates tab and the link "Getting on the Ballot." Papers must be submitted to the clerk's office by 5:00 PM on Tuesday, January 6, 2026.

Property Tax Payments

The Clerk's Office will be closed December 24th, December 25th & January 1st for the Holidays.

Once again for your convenience, **CAPITAL CREDIT UNION**, Kimberly location ONLY, will collect taxes for the Village of Kimberly until January 31, 2026. ANY RESIDENT, not just members, can pay their taxes at the Capital location in Kimberly. They offer extended hours and easy drive-through access.

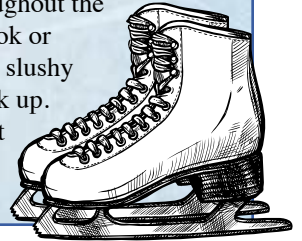
Letters to Santa
