PROOF OF RESIDENCY REGISTER

2026 Election Dates

April 7th: Spring Election

August 11th: Partisan Primary

November 3rd: General Election

Registering online is easy, safe and secure. You can register online or by mail up to 20 days before an election. If you have a valid WI Driver License or WI ID card issued by the DMV you can register online at myvote.wi.gov. If you prefer to register in-person, you can register in our office up until the Friday before an election or at your polling place.

If you have a valid WI driver license, you must provide the number and expiration date.

You must always provide Proof of Residency when registering to vote. It must include your name and current residential address. Acceptable forms include:

- A current and valid State of WI or State ID Card
- Any other official identification card or license issued by a WI governmental body or unit
- Any identification card issued by an employer in the normal course of business and bearing a photo of the card holder (not including a business card)
- A real estate tax bill or receipt for the current year or the year preceding the date of the election
- Residential lease that is effective on date of registration (NOT valid if registering by mail)
- A gas, electric, or telephone service statement (aka utility bill) for the period commencing no earlier than 90 days before the date of registration
- A university, college, or technical college identification card (must include photo) ONLY if the voter provides a fee receipt dated within the last 9 months or the institution provides a certified housing list to the municipal clerk
- An intake document from a residential care facility such as a nursing home or assisted living facility
- A bank, or credit union statement, regardless of the type of account or any credit card statement



Get Registered Today! You cannot register on the Saturday, Sunday or Monday before an election.


Vote absentee,
no reason necessary



If you are a registered voter, you can vote by absentee

You can request an absentee ballot on myvote.wi.gov or make a request to the Village Clerk in writing, electronically, or in person [see note below] using the Application for Absentee Ballot or making a written statement containing all of the information required on the form.

Note: Appearing in-person to request that a ballot be mailed to you starts 14 days before an election. We cannot accept requests made in-person outside of the 14-day window. It is best to apply in writing or by using the MyVote website.



What are the deadlines for making an absentee request?

The request must be in our hands no later than 5:00pm on the 5th day preceding an election. Keep in mind this does not leave much time for the post office to deliver it. The earlier the better!

Regular absentee voters requesting a ballot must provide a copy of their photo ID with their absentee ballot request. Once photo ID is provided, the voter no longer has to provide photo ID with subsequent absentee ballot requests, until they re-register (their name or address changes).  **PHOTO ID** 

Note: A person cannot request an absentee ballot in person and leave the clerk's office with the ballot. The ballot is either voted in the clerk's office, or the clerk must mail the ballot to the elector.

Badger Books– Making Election Day more Efficient!

With these electronic poll books voters can step right up to the next available open table. No more waiting in line by last name or by ward! You need to state your name & address, show your photo ID, and sign your name on the tablet's screen. The Badger Books are used in place of the old paper poll books and are used to check-in and register voters. You do not vote on them– you will still mark your ballot and insert it into the tabulator .
